4. Actions / Recommendations

The Committee is asked to note the applications from NHS Vale of York CCG Practices for General Practice Infrastructure Funds in 2015/16. From a total of 11 applications, 2 improvement grants have been declined, a further 4 improvement grants have been supported in principle but further information is required, and 5 development projects have been supported in principle but further information is required.

5. Engagement with groups or committees

Practices are required to consult with patients regarding any proposed changes to services.

6. Impact on Primary Care

Through the Primary Care Infrastructure Fund there are opportunities for Practices to improve patient access, increase capacity, and provide more integrated services through the co-location of multi-disciplinary teams to help patients manage their conditions closer to home.

7. Significant issues for consideration

The Primary Care Infrastructure Fund provides capital funding for General Practice improvements and developments. At this point, it should be noted that the fund does not provide for any increase in on-going revenue costs (i.e. notional rent).

8. Implementation

The CCG should support Practices in their development of more detailed plans to support the applications that are currently under consideration. The CCG will also need to fully understand any potential additional revenue costs from each scheme.

9. Monitoring

The CCG will monitor progress against each application with NHS England.
