



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1.	Primary Care Briefing on Persistently Crying babies:
	Babies who persistently cry can be a common presentation in general practice. There can be multiple reasons why babies persistently cry and practitioners are faced with the challenge of trying to identify a cause which can range from acute, serious illness to crying that is within normal expectations, often within the confines of a consultation that is only 10 minutes long.
	This briefing looks at persistently crying babies from a safeguarding aspect. It should be used in conjunction with established guidance on managing illness in babies such as the NICE Clinical Knowledge Summaries <u>CKS NICE</u> .

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This campaign is aimed at professionals across North Yorkshire to encourage them to have conversations with new and expectant parents about how they are feeling about a number of aspects of having and caring for a baby.
The key messages are derived from a series of common things that are often a concern to new parents and have been developed in conjunction with the learning identified from our recently commissioned thematic review identifying learning from three similar cases of non- accidental injury to non-mobile infants.
