

Window Safety

Falls from windows often result in serious or fatal injuries, but this harm is avoidable. We want to ensure that providers are keeping people under their care safe. CQC have been alerted to an incident where a care home resident deliberately attempted to bypass a window restrictor on their first-floor bedroom window and, following a fall, sustained injuries that led to their death.

In 2022 we published a 'learning from safety incidents' issue on falls from windows. This publication has been updated on the CQC website to reflect a <u>Health Building</u> <u>Note published by NHS England</u>, which highlights that the British Standard for window restrictors does not factor in deliberate attempts to defeat the restrictor using impact forces. CQC expect providers and registered managers to be aware of and follow best practice guidance. Providers should also be proactive when carrying out person-centred risk assessment that is reflective of a person's individual circumstances and needs, as set out in Regulation 9 and Regulation 12 of the Health and Social Care Act 2008. To manage the risk of falls to residents, registered persons need to ensure the assessment of the risks:

- arising from the premises, and
- for individual residents. Where specific residents are at risk, you may need to take further action to prevent them falling from a height.

Are You Falls Prepared for Winter?

'The world's population is ageing. Falls and related injuries are increasingly common, making their prevention and management a critical global challenge.' (British Geriatrics Society, 2022)

This increasing trend of falls-related injuries, combined with pressure on care services, particularly over winter, emphasises the importance of using 'Falls Awareness Week' as a platform for falls education.

The World Guidelines for Falls Prevention and Management 2022 emphasise the importance of tailored education for hospitalised older adults and other high-risk groups. Examples of well-managed partnership approaches with patients and their friends and family have shown a reduction of up to 58.6 per cent¹ in falls.

Introduction of ReSPECT Process Briefing for Providers

The York and North Yorkshire area is moving towards the adoption of the ReSPECT process. The aim of this is to promote a more patient-centred and consistent approach to advanced care planning. Over the coming year, you will see the introduction of ReSPECT documentation and eventually the phasing out of the "red bordered" DNACPR forms. In order to support staff with this, a number of sessions are planned to talk through the process, and enable you to ask questions. The following sessions, lasting approximately 1.5 hours, are currently available:

• **17.9.24 - 10.00**- The ReSPECT process: a guide for care staff – held on MS Teams and suitable for all working in the social care sector

• **14.10.24** - **10.00**- The ReSPECT process: a guide for LD and autism providers – held face to face in the Education Centre, Saint Catherine's Hospice, Scarborough; suitable on MS teams for any staff caring for clients with learning disabilities and/or autism

The fund is being scaled down in 2024-25 and it will only be possible to claim WDF for qualifications and apprenticeships which started on or before 31 March 2024 and which will complete by 31 March 2025. This year, WDF will be distributed exclusively by Skills for Care.
