
Other updates and important information

We've linked in with the NHS specialist dental team from Harrogate and arranged two dates for some online oral hygiene training, **YOU ONLY NEED TO ATTEND ONE**.

Suitable for Reablement teams/homecare in particular but also others who support people with oral hygiene and mouth care. It will include some tips for supporting people living with conditions such as Dementia, as this links to a recent research study:

Views of homecare staff and carers on oral needs and dental care for people living with dementia: A qualitative study - Dia Soilemezi, Kristina Wanyonyi, Valerie Hill, Jill Manthorpe.

Conclusions of the study were:

- Missed opportunities to address oral care.
- Revise guidance and training.
- Raise awareness of the importance of preventative oral care for people living with dementia at home.
- Better links between social care and dental services.

It's a nice way of showing CQC that we're developing links with health professionals, being current and evidence based in our practice. Dia Soilemezi is also presenting the research paper at our NYC Research community meeting (online) 28th April 1.30pm. If anybody would like that link, let me know.

The Workforce Development Fund 2024-25 is now open

The Workforce Development Fund (WDF) is now open to organisations that provide adult social care services and directly employ care staff within England. The fund is being scaled down in 2024-25 and it will only be possible to claim WDF for qualifications and apprenticeships which started on or before 31 March 2024 and which will complete by 31 March 2025. This year, WDF will be distributed exclusively by Skills for Care.
